#### FIRE BRIGADE NEWS



#### JULY

The Brigade have had an increase in calls attended over the past 12 months—from end May 2016 to end May 2017—totalling 101 calls compared with previous number of calls per annum of approx. 60.

The Brigade have applied for a State Government / CFA / Brigade funded grant for a Thermal Imaging Camera that identifies heat sources that are not visible to the human eye. It is an amazing modern

piece of equipment that could be used at many incidents. The total cost of the camera is \$11,446, with each contributing organisation to cover a third. If successful with the grant, the Brigade contribution will be approx. \$3800.

The Brigade would like to pass on our thanks to the general public for their donations to Little River Fire Brigade collected by The Little River General Store. The amount collected over the past 2 months was \$224.45, a great result. Special thanks to Lisa and Peter for their ongoing support.

The Brigade also collected \$93.60 at the Little River School Fair, likewise a great effort.

On Sunday 25th June, I attended the Little River Lions Club annual luncheon at the Little River Mechanics Institute and was presented with a donation of \$1000 for the Little River Fire Brigade. The Brigade really appreciate the ongoing support by the dedicated members of our local Lions Club members—many thanks to all from the Little River Brigade members.

# 'The Old Cornerstone'

(Below is an expanded version of a speech delivered by Peter Jones at an open air Anglican service on the 11<sup>th</sup> June 2017 on Ripley Road presided over by the Rev. Shirley Littras, Anglican Priest of the Parish of Lara with Little River, to celebrate the 140th Anniversary of laying the foundation stone of St Jame Church of England – 13.06.1877 – 13.06.2017 on its original site.)

Some background is needed – and today, when we look towards the nearby You Yangs – some back-ground. Today is a story of ancient landscape, of recognition of its human use and celebration of a spiritual journey. Today - is also a birthday. The cake will be back at the Hall.

It was 1857 when the first Anglican services were held in Little River. The first Catholic services had been held in 1855. Father Rankine's pear tree from that time can still be admired on the bank of the river by the railway bridge. Traces of his wattle and daub house have long since vanished. Today we welcome Father Frank Buhagiar of St Andrews' Catholic Parish Werribee. In 1864 the Anglican Parish of Station Peak stretched from Little River to Werribee.

In 1877, one hundred and forty years ago the ancient tradition of setting the cornerstone was enacted on this spot. There was a large choir conducted by Miss McCord and a large crown gathered by the site for the church, where his Lordship James Moorhouse, second Bishop of Melbourne said, 'It is customary in the erection of all such edifices to lay with solemnity some principal stone to represent the foundation or corner stone of a building to be dedicated to the special service of God.' A worthwhile project deserves a good start. A cornerstone that unites two walls is a sign to unite those who will worship within and that what is to be placed under the stone will represent a significant moment in time to assist future historians.

Today we thank the Richmond family who have kindly made this 'Time Team' site available for our celebration. We also thank those previous custodians of this ancient landscape, the Aboriginal people, who left it in such stunning condition. Timely, when we still hear the echoes of the recent Reconciliation Week and refer to the inaugural *Reconciliation Action Plan* by our Diocese of Melbourne. At this service we thank the Rt Rev. Bishop Philip Huggins, North West Region Anglican Bishop for being part of the service.

On the 13<sup>th</sup> June 1877, the Bishop and his Chaplain, the Reverend Canon Goodman were luncheon guests of F. W. Armytage, at his substantial property Woolloomanata, who by then was well established and establishment. They were then driven in horse-drawn carriage by his aboriginal driver William Leigh to the corner-stone laying ceremony. William was Wathaurung—born west of Geelong and baptised at Lara C. of E. shortly before his death at 76 in 1912. A contemporary wrote of him: *What a privilege to have known him – so dignified and respected.* 

#### Inippet continued

Here, the corner stone was then elevated and the Bishop handed a silver trowel. This site was next to the Wurdi-Youang School on land formerly owned by Mr John Henry, who was first to speak. He thanked God for the blessing of support of their minister over 20 years by Mr Armytage and the completion of a building project that seemed almost too difficult when first contemplated twelve months before. The Bishop replied, 'We live for either time or eternity. The widow's mite is a greater gift than the abundance of the wealthy and convenient, regular contributions lifted a church from financial difficulties. It is bad to collect money in convulsive fits and starts.'

After the stone was laid the architect stepped forward – Mr Robert Huckson, the most renowned in the history of Little River. He had built Australia's most notable colonial public building – The Treasury, Collins Street. He had designed Australia's southernmost structure – The Maatsuyker Island Lighthouse, Tasmania and had designed Martindale Hall, Clare Valley, South Australia, that became one of cinemas' spookiest colleges for girls in 'Picnic at Hanging Rock'.

Following the Bishop, Huckson now revealed that copies of the *Geelong Advertiser*, *Argus* and *Bacchus Marsh Express* (See photo), together with a number of current coins of the realm had been deposited under the stone along with a scroll with the date of the erection of the edifice, the names of the Governor of Victoria, the Chief Secretary of the



Government, the President of the Shire Council, the Trustees of the building, a record of attendees and others immediately connected therewith and cost, some £400. The amount subscribed up to the time of laying this stone was £210. The items were then deposited in the cavity made for its reception.

Seven months later, the Addie reported that the completed 'pretty little church' in the gothic style had been opened for Divine worship by the Reverend H. B. Macartney, jun., of Caulfield and assisted by the Reverend Alfred Caffin, the incumbent.



The choir rendered choice hymns from *Sankey's Sacred Songs & Solos Selections* such as, *The 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm*, repeated here today. Of the £500 final cost of the Church only £24 remained to be raised.

On Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> December 1877 a tea meeting to commemorate the opening was held in the Assembly Hall, Rothwell Road. *The Geelong Advertiser* reported: Such a large gathering of the kind has never been witnessed in the district. The six tables were amply provided with the usual accompaniments to such meetings by Mesdames Caffin, Chesterfield, Chaffey, Fullaghar, Henry and M'Cord. The aftermeeting was presided over by the Mayor of Geelong. On the platform were the pioneer preacher of the district, the Rev. J. Fullaghar and the rev. J. Caton, of St Philip's Melbourne, who delivered a very able speech on Christian zeal and diligence.

So, even then, there was no such thing as a free lunch. It took 16 years for parishioners to resolve that for St James, the four kilometres from town, was too remote. They sought permission to relocate half a K from the commercial hub. The solution was to choose a herculean, or indeed Sampson-like task. The basalt building would be relocated stone by stone. Henry Rose was to be the coordinating builder. Faithful parishioners, Alex Drysdale and his brother-in-law John Eades, did the work. In the depths of the 1890's economic depression they demolished, then with wheelbarrow, powerful drayhorse & four-wheeled dray they drew 200 tons of demolished bluestone five K then rebuilt, by continually re-positioning a tall timber tripod crane. A grandson of Alex, when he asked, 'How did you do it?', received the reply, 'With grit and determination.'

On the 22nd December 1893 his Lordship Field Flowers Goe DD, third Bishop of

Melbourne (1887-1902), re-named and consecrated the relocated church. It was now in Rothwell Road and henceforth known as Christ Church Little River.

Christ Church is certainly not shut-up and remains put-up. Services continue every Sunday.

#### TUSSOCK TASKS FOR WINTER

Extract from Tussock Times

Serrated tussock is a declared noxious weed, which has detrimental impacts on the environment and agriculture. But how does it look throughout the year and when is the best time to manage it?

Serrated tussock will continue to germinate throughout winter—it can germinate at any time of the year after sufficient rain.

Winter is a good time to conduct surveillance. With the temperature cooling over winter, native and pasture grasses will remain low and stagnant, making it easier to observe serrated tussock. When affected by frost serrated tussock will also appear a lighter bleached colour making it easier to detect.

At this time of year isolated plants are easy to manually remove with a mattock or spade, as the soil is soft. A registered herbicide can be used, although application of the selective herbicide Flupropanate any later than June may not prevent serrated tussock from flowering. Always refer to the product label.

Winter is also a suitable time to control through pasture improvement or cultivation.
